- Critical Thinking** - Exercise sound reasoning, self-reflection of assumptions, and careful consideration of evidence to analyze issues, make decisions, and solve complex problems.
- Problem Solving** - Identify and analyze problems, generate solutions, and implement effective solutions.
- Collaboration** - Build collaborative relationships with individuals representing diverse cultures, races, abilities, ages, genders, religions, lifestyles, and backgrounds within the workplace and across different sectors and communities.
- Responsibility** - Demonstrate personal accountability and integrity; act responsibly in the workplace, community, and global contexts.
- Communication** - Express ideas and thoughts in a clear and concise manner; analyze and synthesize information; and effectively communicate with diverse audiences.
- Technology** - Remain up to date, intellectually curious, and open-minded about technology; use technology effectively and responsibly; and apply technology to solve problems.
- Global Awareness** - Understand personal and professional responsibilities in a global context; and demonstrate cultural competence and global citizenship.
- Creativity** - Use design thinking and curiosity to identify creative solutions; and explore and evaluate ideas for innovation and leadership.
- Curiosity** - Ask questions and investigate "why"; identify needs; actively listen; appropriately seek feedback; and investigate and learn from others.
- Inquiry** - Develop a habit of asking questions; and use inquiry to explore and evaluate ideas for innovation and leadership.
